1. HYPNet audit cervical screening women under 25 – Selena Singh

22.5 year median age
44% Vertical transmission
75% smear performed 58% abnormal cytology
38% moderate/severe
73/124 colposcopy performed of which 65 abnormal

2. Mortality Audit - Caroline Foster

Increase in numbers who have transferred to adult care data via CHiPs database
11 deaths
9 Black African 6 female
2 suicides, 9 HIV/OI related
Median CD4 at death 27
9/11 CD4 below 200
8/11 evidence resistance; 1 had triple class, 2 had 4 class
All had a potentially suppressive regimen available at time of death

3. Vaccine Audit – Liz Hamlyn

MMR deemed safe in paed with CD4 above 200
Little data re immunity for Measles/rubella/Varicella
Data on 55 but not all have complete serology from 5 centres
Mean age 19yrs: 70% born overseas 40% on ARVs

89% females not immune to rubella with majority of females eligible for vaccine
Issue with where funded for vaccines GP or hospital clinics
79% GPs aware status and 59% stated would prefer access via clinic

6. Financial Incentives + MI pilot Susan McDonald

Small group non adherent adolescents seen in 900 clinic

11 enrolled, median CD4 count 30, age 16-25yrs

9/11 VL VL < 50

5/11 sustained VL <50 over 6 month period

All had MI with psychologist and CNS at wk 2/4/8/12/24/36 & 48

Vouchers given based on VL results

Set individual goals with each patient

7 Young people interviewed 17 – 23 yrs age

6 Black African 1 White British

Mean age HIV naming 13.9yrs

6 key themes from interviews

HIV is a secret in relationships

Strategies within relationships

Partner attitude to HIV status

Attributes of partners

Positive response to disclosure

Parenting

8. BREATHER Update (Penta 16) Rahela Choudhury

Study design 5/7 on EFV + 2 NRTIs 2/7 off therapy Vs continuous therapy

8-21 yrs

EFV first line therapy

Stable VL <50 previous 12 months

CD4 350 at enrolment

80 continuous therapy, 80 5/7 on 2/7 off therapy

PILOT study 15 pts randomised to 5/7 on 5/7 off therapy; IDMC has recommended continue to main study

Now flexibility re 2 days off therapy but must always be the same two days

65 randomised to date onto main study

Sub Study

Virology/Immunology study – no PK

Adherence via MEMS caps

Qualitative – UK, Ireland and Uganda
